"Direct Service Component" refers to the primary method of intervention used by a project to achieve its objectives.

"Mediation" refers to an intervention between an alleged offender and a victim or symbolic victim of an offence by a project staff or committee to promote reconciliation, settlement or compromise.

"Referral" refers to the direction by a project staff of a person in need, to a helping resource in the community.

The charts list projects according to the primary source of referral to the project and target population as some projects have more than one source of referral and target group, they are listed more than once.

ACCESSION LIST FOR DIVERSION

INFORMATION BANK

The accession list is primarily a working tool listing files containing a document or a set of documents on a given subject in the Information Bank on Diversion. The files are randomly ordered, to the extent that they are listed as they are developed and not alphabetically by author as would be the case in a bibliography.

The purpose of the listing is to provide access to a body of information culled from journals, memoirs, unpublished reports, bibliographies etc. It is important to note that it does not contain major published works which are available from other sources, e.g., libraries, retail outlets, etc.

All the files are cross-indexed as to author, title and subject(s).

The files pertaining to Conference, Workshops and Diversion projects are examples of files containing more than one document. For example a file on a specific project may contain project description, evaluation reports, monitoring reports, published articles, etc.

If the materials listed are unavailable locally or from the original source, e.g. a project, copies may be obtained by contacting either the National Consultant on Diversion or the Canadian Criminal Justice Reference Centre (see, Information Resource section).
